Dear Madam/Sir,  
I, Mahesh Jagannath Kamath, an asylum seeker in Luxembourg (Matricule: 1992112806723, Reference: R 25739), lodge this complaint against maladministration by Luxembourg's Directorate of Immigration and Luxembourg Police on October 27, 2025. Attached are two detailed complaint letters and supporting evidence documenting these incidents, which violate Dublin III Regulation (EU) No 604/2013, EU Charter of Fundamental Rights, and Luxembourg's Criminal Code and Law of 18 December 2015.

1. Directorate of Immigration Incident (27 October 2025, 10:00 AM, 26, route d'Arlon, L-1130 Luxembourg): During my Dublin Procedure interview, the interviewer (unknown name, brown-skinned, dark yellow pullover, jeans) denied me an interpreter, falsified the protocol by omitting critical details (e.g., persecution by Ambani/Adani, ECHR violations in Switzerland), and intimidated me with Vigicore security guards. These actions breach Dublin III Regulation, Articles 4-5 (accurate protocol, interpreter), EU Charter, Articles 3, 6, 47 (dignity, fair hearing, effective remedy), and Luxembourg Law of 18 Dec 2015, Articles 14-15. The false protocol risks an unfair Dublin transfer, potentially leading to my deportation to India, where I face death, orphaning my daughters.

2. Luxembourg Police Incident (27 October 2025, ~14:00, 1, Rue Marie Et Pierre Curie, 1369 Bonnevoie-Nord-Verlorenkost): Officers (female, badge Q258; male, badge Z272) refused to register my Anzeige against the interviewer and guards, citing Criminal Code Articles 240, 254, 255, 231 (abuse of authority, false statements). They refused to activate body cameras despite my requests, attempted to confuse me by demanding specific legal articles, and falsely directed me to the Migration Department. This violates Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 46 (duty to register complaints), Criminal Code, Article 240 (negligence), and EU Charter, Article 47 (effective remedy). I have digital evidence (audio/video) of this interaction.

### Requests:

Investigate maladministration by the Directorate of Immigration and Police.  
Invalidate the October 27, 2025, Dublin interview and order a new interview with an interpreter.  
Secure CCTV footage (26, route d'Arlon, ~10:30-11:00 AM; police station, ~10:00-11:00, October 27, 2025 and of Police station at 1, Rue Marie Et Pierre Curie, 1369 Bonnevoie-Nord-Verlorenkost).  
Suspend any Dublin transfer decisions pending resolution.  
Due to the urgency of my asylum case and the risk of deportation, I request an expedited investigation. I am available to provide digital evidence and further details. Please provide a case number and interpreter support for proceedings.

## In what way do you consider that the EU institution or EU body has acted incorrectly?

Luxembourg's Directorate of Immigration, implementing EU law (Dublin III Regulation), denied me an interpreter, falsified my interview protocol, and intimidated me with security guards on 27 October 2025, breaching Articles 4-5 of Dublin III and Articles 3, 6, 47 of the EU Charter. Luxembourg Police refused to register my complaint, violating Article 47. These actions risk an unfair Dublin transfer and deportation to India, where I face death.

## What, in your view, should the institution or body do to put things right?

The European Ombudsman should Investigate Luxembourg's Directorate of Immigration and Police for maladministration.

Invalidate the October 27, 2025, Dublin interview due to violations of Dublin III Regulation (Articles 4-5) and EU Charter (Articles 3, 6, 47).

Order a new interview with an interpreter and accurate protocol.

Ensure preservation of CCTV footage (26, route d'Arlon and police station, October 27, 2025) and my digital evidence.

Suspend any Dublin transfer decisions until resolution.

## Have you already contacted the EU institution or EU body about the matter you raise?

Yes

I have attached two emails sent to Luxembourg's Directorate of Immigration ([immigration.dublin@mai.etat.lu](mailto:immigration.dublin@mai.etat.lu)) on October 27, 2025, addressing the violations during my Dublin Procedure interview (no interpreter, false protocol, intimidation). I also attempted to file a criminal complaint with Luxembourg Police (1, Rue Marie Et Pierre Curie, Bonnevoie-Nord-Verlorenkost) on October 27, 2025, against the interviewer and Vigicore security guards, but officers (badges Q258, Z272) refused to register it, as documented in my attached complaint letters. Additionally, I provide digital evidence (audio/video of the police interaction, available upon request) and note CCTV footage from both locations for preservation.

This complaint addresses ongoing maladministration by Luxembourg's authorities in implementing EU law (Dublin III Regulation and EU Charter of Fundamental Rights).
